He earned a B.A. in Psychology/Forensic Psychology from Southern New Hampshire University. While residing in Atlanta, Kent served as president of the Southeastern Arts, Media, and Education Project (S.A.M.E.) which produced over 70 plays, original films, and video works including *Promise of Life*, a documentary on people living with AIDS. He has been a theater ambassador for the National New Play Network, a board member for The Theatre League of South Florida, a judge for the Carbonell Awards, and is proud to have been involved in the 2017 Oscar award-winning movie, *Moonlight*.

**Brian Cohen** is a South Florida born storyteller. Upon earning a MBA from MIT's Sloan School of Management, he was employed as a marketing executive, spearheading a consumer goods company's nationwide strategy. Compelled to follow another trajectory, Brian resigned and began working on short films and screenplays. He relocated to Los Angeles and started over, learning about the Film & TV industry from the ground up. Then, returning to South Florida, he entrenched himself in its diverse theatre community; playwriting and producing one-act plays. He has taught Story Writing and Script Writing courses at Miami Ad School.

**Rachel Finley**'s work includes stage, film, spoken word poetry and performance art. She holds a BFA from Carnegie Melon University and an MFA from Florida Atlantic University. Most recently, Rachel was a lead actor in the dramatic series Motherless, debuted her performance piece, American Bullet, on GableStage's digital platform, served as both the casting director and intimacy director for the short film The Sweetest Girl and directed Sons of Liberty for True Mirage Theatre. Finley is currently an assistant professor of Acting at Arizona State University.

**Vanessa Garcia** is a playwright, screenwriter, journalist, and novelist. Her play *The Amparo Experience* won a Ruth Foreman Award, played to sold out audiences for 8 months, and was called Miami's Hottest Ticket in 2019 by People en Español. Her novel, *White Light*, was one of NPRs Best Books of 2015 and won an International Latino Book Award. Her articles and essays have appeared in the LA Times, The Huffington Post, The Guardian, The Washington Post, American Theatre Magazine, and numerous other publications. For TV, she's written for *Sesame Street*, *Caillou*, and others, and holds a PhD from UCI.

**Stuart Meltzer** is the Artistic Director and a founding member of Zoetic Stage. He is the proud recipient of numerous Carbonell Awards for Best Director. He is also a Carbonell Award winner for Best New Work for his play The Goldberg Variations. Altogether, he has been honored with eighteen Carbonell nominations. His directing credits include American Son, The Wolves, The Curious Incident of the Dog in the Night-Time, Dracula, Fun Home, Dancing Lessons, Wrongful Death and Other Circus Acts, Topdog/Underdog, The Caretaker, Sunday in the Park with George, After, Passion, Rapture, Blister, Burn, Stripped, Betrayal, Trust, Detroit, The Great God Pan, Assassins and Fear Up Harsh. He is the recipient of five Silver Palm Awards for his work as the Resident Director of Zoetic Stage. He received his MFA in Directing from the Actors' Studio in 2002.

**Eric Sharp** is a multidisciplinary theatre artist and EDI consultant based in Minneapolis. He has appeared onstage nationally and internationally at the Guthrie Theater, Ten Thousand Things, The Jungle Theater, Theatre de la Jeune Lune, The Playwrights' Center, Atlanta's Alliance Theatre, and the Toronto and Edinburgh Fringe Festivals.
